



Instructions for Poekie Cape with Hood(big and small)

(Time to complete: twenty minutes)

Materials needed:

- Paper for your printer
- Ruler
- Scissors
- Fabric
- Marker or pen for tracing
- Pin
- Needle
- Thread
- Button

How to make it:

For an experienced Poekie maker this is easy to make. After printing and cutting the pattern,^{*2} follow these steps:

- Place the cape pattern on an edge on the wrong side of your fabric.*³
- Trace around the pattern.
- Cut ON the lines you traced.
- Place, trace and cut the Hood pattern twice, one time with an X, and one time with an O.
- With the right sides together (pen-marks on the outside), place and pin the hood pieces together.
- Get a needle and thread*⁵ and tie a knot at the end.*⁷
- Sew back-stitch*⁶ along the striped line from #1 to #2, as marked on the pattern.
- Tie a knot when you get to #2.
- Cut the thread.
- Turn the hood right side out.
- Tie another knot at the end of the thread and keep it ready.
- Place the seam you just sewed, at #2, in the middle of the small curve of the cape, and match up the edge of the hood with the curve of the cape until you come to a corner of the hood, almost, but not completely, to the front corner of the cape.
- Back-stitch the edge of the hood onto the curve of the cape until you come to the other corner of the hood.
- Tie a knot and cut the thread.
- Sew a button at the top of the cape right under the hood, and cut a buttonhole on the other side.
- Your cape is done. If you want you can cut ear-holes in the hood, but be careful don't cut while your Poekie is wearing his or her cape!

I can't wait to see what you've made at home and let me know if any part of these instructions is confusing!
